NON-CREDIT

BASIS OF CREDIT

Academic credit is awarded in terms of semester hours. Regardless of the length of a semester or term, the same academic credit is awarded and a standard number of contact hours is maintained. Continuing Education Credit (CEU) is awarded for total contact hours. One hour in class is equal to one clock hour. Continuing Education Units (CEU's) measure completion of segments in work force programs. One CEU represents ten contact hours of participation.

NUMBERING OF COURSES

All semester hour course numbers have four digits. The first digit identifies the level of the course: "1" indicates a freshmen level of the course, and "2" indicates a sophomore level of the course. The second digit indicates semester hour credit value of the course. Effective Fall 1989, all developmental courses are designated by a "0" in the first digit.

INCOMPLETES

The grade "I" is conditional. A student receiving an "I" must arrange to complete the course work by the end of the following term (excluding summer), if not completed, the "I" becomes an "F" (I/F) and is then included in the cumulative GPA. If completed, the grade earned is indicated by I/ and is calculated in the cumulative GPA.

REPEATED COURSES

ACADEMIC STANDING

Good Standing - not designated.

Probation - student eligible to enroll in institution.

Continued Probation - Student eligible to enroll in institution.

Enforced Academic Withdrawal - student eligible to re-enroll after one semester (excluding summer) for first suspension and two semesters (excluding summer) for second suspension.

Enforced Academic Withdrawal/Reinstated - student permitted conditional enrollment following suspension.

Dean's List - noted each semester for students who complete 12 or more semester hours for the term and have a term grade point average of 3.5 or better.

Honor's List – indicated for a term grade point average of 3.0 to 3.49.
