I have spent most of my life employed in the public service sector, more than 20 years in the United States Army, and more than 8 years as a Thurston County Deputy Sheriff. After returning from a deployment to Afghanistan in 2014, I was looking for additional ways to serve my community and discovered that the Thurston County Sheriff's Office had a reserve deputy program. This program allowed community members to attend a state-certified training program and volunteer hours in the community as a Sheriff's Deputy. I spent approximately 6 years donating my time in this capacity while working as a Soldier until my retirement from the Army in 2021, when I transitioned to work as a full-time deputy.

An intense interest in public service and in successful government operations at the county and state levels is what led me to seek out a Master's in Public Administration. Evergreen State College Masters in Public Administration program immediately struck me as an amazing opportunity full of knowledgeable staff, a program centered on inclusive and effective solutions to community problems, and Evergreen State College is an integral part of the local community I cherish. I do my best to embody this philosophy by contributing in both monetary and non-monetary ways.
