# HISTORY

Adams State University, founded in 1921 by the Colorado General Assembly, opened June 15, 1925. The name Adams State honors longtime San Luis Valley resident William "Billy" Adams, former state senator and governor of Colorado.

## ACCREDITATION

Adams State University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission, North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, the National Association of Schools of Music, the Council for Accreditation of Counseling & Related Educational Programs, the American Association of State Colleges & Universities, the American Association of Colleges & Universities, the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education, and maintains membership in the American Association of Collegiate Schools of Business and is approved by the American Association of University Women.

### CALENDAR

Credits are recorded in semester hours unless otherwise noted. One semester hour is equal to one recitation period for one semester of approximately 16 weeks. The normal student load per semester is 12 semester hours. A minimum of 60 semester hours of academic credit are required for an associate's degree. A minimum of 120 semester hours of academic credit are required for a bachelor's degree. A minimum of 30 semester hours of credit at the graduate level are required for a master's degree. A minimum of 66 semester hours of credit are required for completion of a doctoral degree.

Prior to fall semester 1977, credits were issued in quarter hours. These have been converted to semester hours. One quarter hour is equal to one recitation period for one quarter of approximately twelve weeks. The normal student load per quarter was 15 quarter hours. A minimum of 180 quarter hours of academic credit plus 6 quarter hours in physical education activities were required for the Bachelor of Arts degree. A minimum of 45 quarter hours of credit at the graduate level were required for the Master of Arts degree.

#### **COURSE NUMBERING**

0-099 are basic skills courses 100-299 are lower division 300-499 are upper division 500-699 are master level courses 700-899 are doctoral level courses

Basic skills courses are not counted toward graduation or in GPA. Graduate students may register for 300 or 400 level courses and receive graduate credit if approved by the instructor and chair of major area. Graduate credit will require the student to complete work in addition to that required of undergraduates. These courses will appear on the graduate transcript. Beginning fall 2006, a maximum of 9 credit hours of upper division coursework may be approved for graduate credit.

## **REPEATED COURSES**

The hours of a repeated course count only once. The most recent grade is calculated in the GPA. A repeat is indicated on the transcript: E = Excluded from GPA and does not count toward fulfillment of graduation requirements.

## TEST SCORE CREDIT

ASU accepts DANTES, SAT/ACT, IB (International Baccalaureate) and CLEP credit from subject (not general) examinations toward its bachelor degree programs. These will have grades of "P" (pass) and be indicated as exam credit via a comment beneath each course.

### CAT SCORES

A teacher education student's scores (on National Norms) on the California Achievement Test (CAT), Level 19, Forms C or D, are at or above the 75<sup>th</sup> percentile in the areas of Spelling, Language Mechanics and Expression, and Mathematics Computation and Concepts.
