ACADEMIC FRESH START

Effective Fall 1996

A currently enrolled student may request to have up to 18 credits removed from the grade point average for grades of D, F, and WF by petitioning for Academic Fresh Start. This applies to courses taken two or more calendar years ago, may be used only once, and is not reversible. The original credit and grade will remain on the transcript with a notation indicating that Academic Fresh Start has been granted and the grade point average has been adjusted. The student must have achieved a grade point average of 2.5 in his/her last 15 semester credits completed at any accredited college or university.

ACADEMIC RENEWAL

Effective Spring 2013

Academic Renewal is a program through which a student can exclude previously earned “below average” grades (D and F grades) from his/her cumulative GPA. A currently enrolled student may request to have up to 30 credits excluded from the grade point average by petitioning for Academic Renewal. The original credit and grade will remain on the transcript with a notation indicating that Academic Renewal has been granted. The student must have been out of school for two years and have completed at least 6 hours with a 2.000 term GPA prior to petitioning. Academic Renewal can only be granted once and is not reversible.

ACADEMIC STATUS

Student is in good standing unless otherwise indicated. Only academic honors or suspension appear on the records. The Dean of Student Success is the authority to contact to inquire about disciplinary matters.

ACCREDITATION

PCC is accredited by The Higher Learning Commission.

COLORADO GTPATHWAY COMPLETED

This statement refers to a block of classes that, when successfully completed as part of an AA or AS degree, are designed to transfer to Colorado's public four-year colleges and universities.

COURSE REPEATS

Students may repeat courses, but repeated courses may only be counted once towards graduation requirements. The highest grade earned will be computed in the student's semester and cumulative GPA. However, all previously attempted grades will be noted on the student's permanent records. The transcript will contain an appropriate entry to indicate that the GPA has been recomputed. I=include in GPA calculation. E=exclude from GPA calculation
