Tacoma city council bands camping within 10 blocks of temporary shelters beginning

Nov, 14 2023

The ordinance makes public camping within the impacted areas a misdemeanor offense

punishable by up to a \$250 fine or up to 30 days in jail.

A proposed ordinance could mean banning unsanctioned encampments within 10 blocks of

shelters operated by the city.

Proponents said it would help channel people into much-needed programs, but opponents said

it's just literally pushing the problem down the road.

BACKGROUND

of the exposure to human waste, drug paraphernalia and /or inclement weather.
