I got to know Gail as a student in two of my courses in literary studies at Central Washington University. Her dedication to her work, impressive analytical skills, and engaging writing all leave her well prepared for the sustained work of graduate studies.

I am confident that the combination of her professional experience and impressive analytical thinking will make her a strong asset to her graduate school cohort. I am likewise certain that the program would benefit her in providing an opportunity to explore how to draw together her experiences with small businesses and corporations and her skills as a storyteller and editor.
