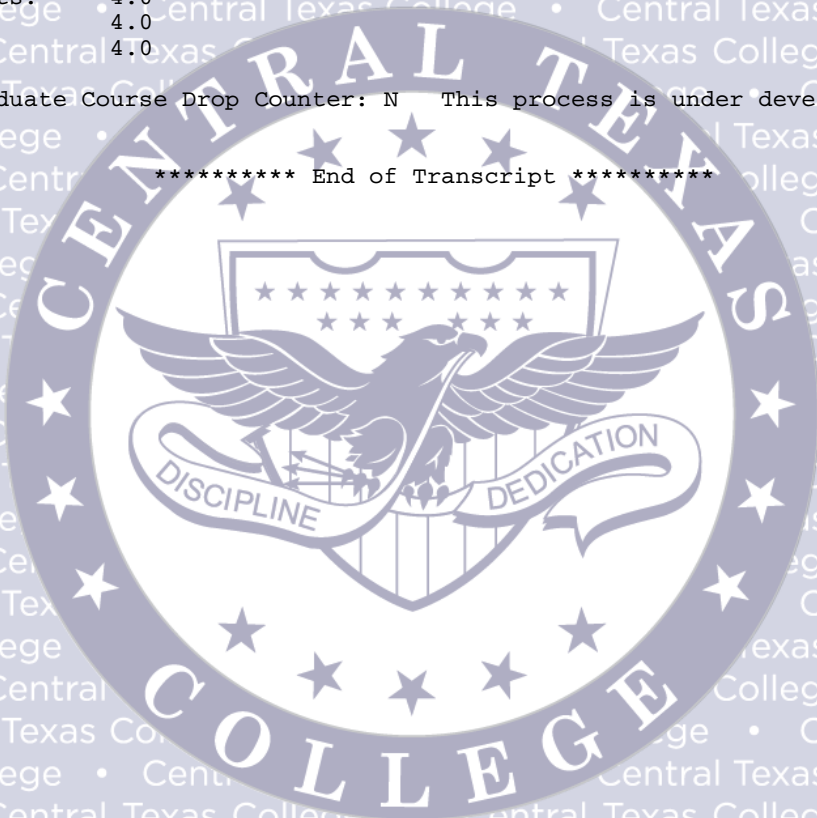

Calendar: Fall and Spring semesters are 16 weeks each with first- and second 8-week classes offered. Summer I semesters are 5 ½ weeks with 10-week classes offered. Summer II semesters are 5 ½ weeks. Other 8-week and shortened classes may be offered.

Semester Credit Hours: The unit for credit courses is a semester credit hour (SCH). Example: A 3-SCH course contains 45- 48 contact hours made up of 50 minutes per contact hour. Courses taught in fewer weeks must have the same number of contact hours. Nontraditional courses (i.e. online and blended) have the same learning outcomes to an equivalent traditionally delivered course.

Course Numbering System: 3 digits were used 1967 to 1981: 1st digit = 1-Freshman, 2-Sophomore, 2nd digit = semester credit hour value, 3rd digit = unique course identifier. After 1981 CTC began using 4-digits: 1st digit = Courses beginning with a 0-Developmental, 1-Freshman, 2-Sophomore, 2nd digit = semester credit hour value, 3rd and 4th digits = unique course identifier.

Grading System: CTC uses a four-point grading system.				Academic Fresh Start: Section 51.931 of the Texas Education Code allows a Texas resident applying for admission/readmission to CTC who has academic course work taken 10 or more years prior to the planned enrollment to have those credits ignored for academic GPA computation.

Grade Point Average (GPA): Student GPA is calculated by dividing the sum of the earned quality points by the sum of attempted hours for all courses receiving a grade used in calculating the GPA. Only coursework taken at CTC is included in the GPA.

Repeated Courses: Repeated courses are marked with a (R) next to the course under the GPA column. Prior to Fall 2016 the last grade earned was used in computing the CTC GPA. Since Fall 2016 the highest grade earned is used in computing the CTC GPA. A CTC grade can only be replaced by repeating the same course at CTC. Both grades remain on the transcript.

Transfer Credits: Prior to Fall 2001 transfer credits were shown as the number of semester credit hours accepted from each institution. Since Fall 2001 transfer college credit courses appear on the transcript based on transfer credit policies in the official CTC Campus catalogs.

Eligible to Re-Enroll: Eligibility to enroll is based on academic probation, suspension, and dismissal institutional policies. Eligibility to re-enroll for reasons other than academic or financial are based on institutional policies and Section 51.9364 of the Texas Education Code. Refer to CTC catalog at www.ctcd.edu.
