I am writing to provide my enthusiastic support and recommendation for Sydney Debien's acceptance into your Master of Public Administration (MPA) program. Sydney's participation in your program will not only allow her to grow her professional skills but will directly benefit her current work to help our state's forested ecosystems and communities remain health and resilient in a changing climate.

I met Sydney in 2019, when our agency created the Forest Resilience Division in recognition that a reorganization of agency structure was necessary to achieve the agency's mission to manage, sustain, and protect the health and productivity of Washington's lands and waters to meet the needs of present and future generations and support the Commissioner of Public Lands as the designated state lead on all forest health issues. In this time, I have witnessed Sydney build business operations systems to support ten programs working statewide to support partners and communities in maintaining and restoring their forests from city centers to national forests. I believe her participation in the MPA program will help her grow into an excellent leader, while her applied experience will bring direct benefit to other program participants.
