It is with pleasure that I write this letter of support for Jillian Morris who is applying for the Mater of Public Administration with the Tribal Governance Track at the Evergreen State College. I have known Jillian since Fall 2021 as a college instructor and research supervisor at Washington State University Vancouver. I have had various interactions with her and feel I know her well enough to speak about her academic competency, commitment to Tribal communities, and her mature personality.

I first noticed Jillian's passion to improve the lives of disadvantaged populations—especially those in Tribal communities—when she enrolled in my class, *Families in Poverty*. Witnessing her academic competence and profound interest in the well-being of marginalized families, I invited her to join my research project. While Jillian excelled as an undergraduate student, initially, my expectations were modest, anticipating her assistance with simple tasks to facilitate the team's progress. This was because my research is intricate, involving meticulous analyses of qualitative interviews from multiple U.S. states, communication with Principal Investigators in other land grant universities, and collaboration with a doctoral student. Based on my past experiences, it was reasonable to expect that an undergraduate student who had not been previously engaged in research might not make significant contributions.

However, Jillian defied my expectations. Her initial assignment involved reviewing multiple interview transcripts detailing the family health experiences of rural, low-income mothers in Florida, Kentucky, and Washington, and creating family profiles for each case. These interview transcripts, averaging 20 pages for each interview, presented a considerable challenge. Yet, Jillian adeptly identified key issues faced by these families and systematically organized the information by applying Family Stress Theory.

Impressed by her exceptional work, Jillian was subsequently invited to play a key role in the qualitative analysis process. This included developing coding schemes, applying codes

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to approximately 30 interview transcripts, and ensuring inter-coder reliability. The analysis proved to be complex, given that qualitative methodology entails an ongoing dialogue between theory and data. Coders were free to suggest changes or additions to coding schemes throughout the process. Jillian swiftly evolved into a valuable team member, not only conducting analysis but also assuming a leadership role in coordinating multiple meetings, facilitating discussions, establishing final coding schemes, and identifying major themes within and across codes. Jillian's leadership, mature personality, and collegiality significantly enriched our research project.

By the time of her graduation, Jillian had delivered presentations at various conferences at the campus, regional, and national levels—a remarkable achievement for an individual who had not yet earned a master's degree. Below is a list of her presentations, underscoring her impressive contributions. Currently, our research team is in the process of writing two manuscripts which will be submitted to peer-reviewed journals, with Jillian rightfully earning authorship in these scholarly works. Upon concluding her education at Washington State University Vancouver, she graduated with honors, receiving *Magna Cum Laude* distinction, alongside the *Outstanding Human Development Senior Award*.
